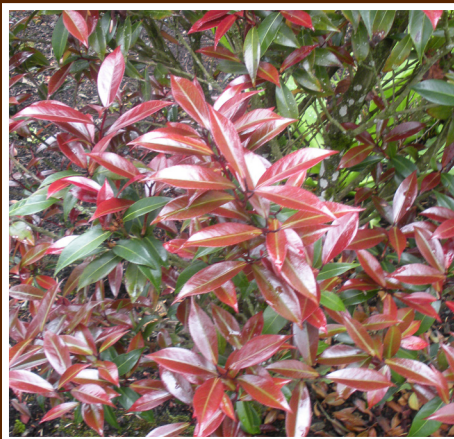

Time really does fly, I am remembering all the personal and world events I have covered in this short little letter over the years. There are many positive events we have covered and a few challenging ones. We have survived illnesses individually, a global pandemic, record weather events across the country, the passing of many friends and family (family includes our companions in the animal world), as well as many changes to our operation and business. Many of you have been with us the whole way. We sincerely appreciate all of your loyalty and support through the good times and the bad over these past three decades.

It's time for the annual "what's the gang been up to this year". Roger recently got back from a trip to New York. He had a great time and saw 4 plays in 5 nights! He saw Parade, Sweeney Todd, Good Night Oscar, and Camelot. It was all going great until he tried to come home, he got caught in the 4th of July weather and United Airlines meltdown. So, to get him home we found a nice hostel for the first night, then a midnight Greyhound bus through Pittsburg and Toledo to Chicago. Then, a hotel by the airport and an Alaska Airlines ride back to Eugene. So 72 hours of fun and excitement touring the upper Midwest! There are two things, if you know Roger, that you would never expect to have in a story about him. One is him staying in a hostel hotel and the other one is a 21 hour Greyhound ride. He took it all in stride and gained several funny stories along the way.

Dawn just mailed in her official retirement papers this week. This is a scary and exciting time for us. She intends to work for the rest of this school year and one more taking advantage of the shortage of Speech and Language Pathologist. She has had a very frustrating year for her horses. We lost Major at the end of April to colic. He was 27 years old and had a great life up to the very last day. Her other two horses have both been battling injuries for the last several months. So, 2023 has not been the greatest year for her horse addiction.

Pierce and Mia have moved back in with us temporarily. This has been an adjustment as we thought we had achieved empty nest status and then they are back. We are going to build an apartment where we have been doing the air bnb for the last year and a half. We are planning on starting the first of October and hopefully have them in not too long after the first of the year. Pierce has picked up golfing this summer and it has been great to play with him. One of the things I still miss is the many, many rounds of golf I played with Marj over the years. She was always ready to go hit the ball and really loved the sport.

This year has been filled with work on the Hazelnut project and attempting to keep up with everything else along the way for me. We planted another 10 acres last winter, bringing our total to just under 50 acres! Little did I know when we started this the monster I was creating. If you are out there reading this, please eat hazelnuts in everything. Last year's harvest was around 14,000 pounds and this year we are hoping for 27-30,000 pounds. Eventually we will be producing somewhere around 160,000 pounds of nuts a year. One of the questions I get most is where do we sell them? We sell to a family operation called Denfeld Packing. They process and turn the in-shell nuts to finished product under the name Laurel Foods, so if you're interested you can Google Laurel Foods and see what they do. I just got back from another Alaska fishing trip. Every year I go up there, it is a little different between the weather and the fish, as each year is a learning experience. I brought home about 175 pounds of Halibut fillets

this year, that is always one of my main goals. This year we had some of the closest Humpback whale encounters ever. They were so close you could make eye contact and get sprayed when they breathed.

The nursery has had a good season so far, we are flush with new plants and are looking forward to getting them to you for your gardens. For the first time in many years, we are offering a large number of new magnolias. We are listing over a hundred varieties this year. We are excited to have these new specimens available and ready to get them to the public. One of the most exciting things for this year is the expansion of the Hellebore's we will have available. Northwest Garden Nursery has done some of the best hybridizing anywhere in the world. We now have several thousand growing and these will be ready for you this winter. Northwest Garden Nursery and us have had joint open houses each winter for the Hellebores. This year they will not be selling Hellebore's and we will be the only place to purchase their introductions during those open weekends. Please remember we will have these all fall and winter, so you don't need to wait till the open houses to come and purchase them or order them any time.

Roger is getting ready to lead a tour group this September to the Northeast. There are going to be about 10 people and the tour is sponsored by the Willamette Valley Hardy Plant Group. Roger loves doing these trips because sharing the gardens and museums with people is one of his favorite things. One of the things with Roger traveling and us running the entire operation with just Roger, Eric and our one employee Wayne, is be patient with getting ahold of us, we do the best we can to respond in a timely fashion but sometime that can be difficult. For example, this September while Roger is hosting the tour on the East Coast, I will be in the middle of hazelnut harvest. If you try to reach us and we don't get right back please try another way or call us so we can take care of you (Roger's cell number is available when you leave a message so feel free to use that if necessary). We are not ignoring you and we want your business and want to answer your questions, so please be patient with us.

We would like to thank all of those who make our life here at the farm possible. As always, we will start with Wayne Headlee. Wayne has worked here for on and off 30 years, he knows the plants and most importantly he can put up with us! Lisa Seibright helps with the inventory and she helps put this catalog into a usable format. Dianna Learner helps go over the catalog each year pointing out most of our mistakes. There are many others who are always ready to jump in and help. This winter during the orchard planting project we had 9 friends and family out there for 2 days helping plant 1080 trees. Your help and friendship is greatly appreciated.

ABIES

A. BALSAMEA 'PICCOLO'- This low grower is more horizontal growing than vertical. Was found in Germany. This plant has deep green curled needles. Seems to be much smaller than A. balsamea 'Nana'. 1 gal. \$ 60.00

A. CONCOLOR 'WATTEZII' (WATTEZ PROSTRATE) – is a prostrate fir with beautiful needles. If a leader appears, please remove as it will make an upright tree. A lovely mounding conifer. 2 gal. \$ 85.00

A. KOREANA 'ALPINE STAR'- Comes from Scotland and is deepest green. This healthy small conical plant will make a beautiful specimen plant year round. 1 gal. \$ 75.00



A. KOREANA 'HORSTMANN'S SILBERLOCKE'—is a narrow upright Korean fir. The reflexed needles are dark green. The undersides of the needles are silver. Will have purple, blue cones in early summer. A very striking conifer. 5 gal. \$ 100.00

A. KOREANA 'ICE BREAKER'- This glorious dwarf conifer has curled needles similar to A. koreana 'Silberlocke'. The plant has its needles turn totally around the stems creating a white and green effect. 1 gal. \$ 65.00
2 gal. \$ 90.00

A. KOREANA 'OBERON'- Came to us from Stolwijk Nursery, Netherlands. This deep green foliated plant has short needles. Slowly makes a leader, but will always be very small. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. KOREANA 'SILBERZWERG'- is a dwarf conifer with growth of 1½ inch per year. The medium green needles are small and closely packed on the stems. 2 gal. \$ 70.00

A. KOREANA 'TUNDRA'- Can eventually form a leader in many years. This very small Korean fir has deep green needles. The original was found as witches broom in Germany. 2 gal. \$ 70.00

A. NORDMANIANA 'GOLDEN SPREADER'- I always see this plant in gardens and want to add it to our garden. (We already have a plant in a container). So, it's always a challenge not to buy more plants. This prostrate grower gets 18"x36" and is glowing golden yellow, especially in the winter. 1 gal. \$ 70.00

A. PINSAPO 'FASTIGIATA'- This old cultivar from France is upright growing and is fairly fast growing. The tight needles are beautiful blue green. 1 gal. \$ 75.00

ACER

A. BUERGERANUM 'MIYASAMA-YATSUBUSA'- is a very slow grower to perhaps 6'-8'x3' in many years. The leaves are deep shiny green all summer and are very tightly packed creating a full dense canopy. This Japanese cultivar originated before 1900, but is still rare because of its slow growth. 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. CAMPESTRE 'CARNIVAL'- The English hedge maple makes a small shrubby tree with deep green leaves. A. campestre 'Carnival' is a small version (8-10') over a long time. The foliage is white with a light green center. 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. CIRCINATUM 'PACIFIC FIRE' - A vine maple with brilliant red stems all winter. This cultivar seems upright growing and the stems almost glow. The fall foliage is red and yellow. Extra shipping 3 gal. \$ 125.00

A. CIRCINATUM 'SUNGLOW'- Has lovely yellow orange foliage eventually turning light green. Great yellow fall color. 1 gal. \$ 125.00
Nursery Only 15 gal. \$ 150.00

A. JAPONICUM 'ACONITIFOLIUM'- One of our favorites. The 'Fern leaf maple' will eventually get 20' tall. The split leaves are medium green all summer. In fall, the leaves turn the most beautiful red orange and yellow. Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 125.00

A. JAPONICUM 'FAIRY LIGHTS'- Has cut leaves similar to A. japonicum 'Aconitifolium' (fern leaf maple) but they are much more cut. The bushy plant will be a smaller grower than A. japonicum 'Aconitifolium'. Great fall color. 2 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'ALPINE DWARF'- Has a rich red growth in spring. This shrubby small 5'x5' shrub will have color in spring and in fall will turn brilliant red. 1 gal. \$ 75.00



A. PALMATUM 'ARCTIC FLAME'- Has orange red new foliage turning purple green all summer. One of Crispin Silva's selections. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'BENI KAWA'- This maple is similar looking to A. pal. 'Sango-Kaku'. The great thing is A. pal. 'Beni Kawa' is dramatically hardier. A. pal. 'Sango Kaku' will regularly have winter damage or die even in western Oregon. The beautiful red stems through out the winter are preceded by green summer foliage and great yellow fall color. Extra Shipping 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'BIHOU'- This plant looks like A. palmatum 'Sango Kaku'. The foliage is similar and the form is similar. The difference is the bark is yellow orange in winter rather than red. This upright tree is very special all winter. Nursery only 5 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'BLOODGOOD'- is one of the standards of the Japanese maple world. The foliage is deep purple in spring-summer. Will eventually get 20'x15' and will have glorious red fall color. Nursery only. Too big to ship. Nursery only 10 gal. \$ 125.00

A. PALMATUM 'BONFIRE'- The new foliage is vibrant pink. After several weeks, it changes to dark green. In fall, this 8'-10' tree will change to bright red orange fall foliage. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'BUTTERFLY'- This plant has been available for many decades. Our plant is 40+ years old is 15' tall and 6'-8' wide. The pink-white variegated leaves are beautiful all summer. We do some minor pruning each summer to remove the reversions.

Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'CHANTILLY LACE'- is a lace leaf with extra laciness. The new growth is pink-bronze. As the summer continues it will turn chartreuse green with the new growth showing the pink 2 gal. \$ 100.00



A. PALMATUM 'DRAGON MASTER'- is a golden leafed Japanese maple. The difference is its strongly weeping. An interesting plant to put on top of a wall to cascade down. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'FAIRY HAIR' - One of Talon Buchholz selections. This is the narrowest foliaged of any Acer palmatum. Eventually a 10'-12' lacy small tree. 1 gal. \$ 80.00

A. PALMATUM 'FIREGLOW'- is a medium sized Japanese maple to 20'x15' with deep purple leaves during spring and summer. Fall color is brilliant red. Nursery only 10 gal. \$ 125.00

A. PALMATUM 'GEISHA GONE WILD'- is a vibrant variegated pink, white and green maple. This selection by Talon Buchholz leafs out in spring with the most beautiful pink leaves and slowly changes to green, pink and white. A. pal. 'Geisha Gone Wild' will get to 15' in time. 2 gal. \$ 120.00

A. PALMATUM 'GOLDEN FALLS'- is a chance seedling from A. p. 'Ryusen'. This maple will grow just as tall as it's staked as all stems are cascading. The new growth is brilliant golden orange. Staying yellow in summer then changing to orange yellow. 1 gal. \$ 80.00

A. PALMATUM 'HUPPS DWARF'- is a neat small (2'-3') shrubby Japanese maple. The new growth is pink through spring and summer. Would make a pretty plant for even the smallest garden. 1 gal. \$ 120.00

A. PALMATUM 'KURENAI JISHI'- Said to be a crisped leafed red foliaged (purple) and stays small, growing maybe 6' tall. 1 gal. \$ 100.00



A. PALMATUM 'KURO HIME'- is a dwarf grower to 5'. Said to be vigorous, but stays small. The green leaves have a pink margin. In fall, the foliage turns orange. 1 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'LILEEANNE'S JEWEL'- is a 15' grower with consistent variegated pink and purple growth all summer. A. pal. 'Lilecann's Jewel' will not revert as A. pal. 'Rainbow'. This plant will be a real show stopper in your garden. 2 gal. \$ 120.00



A. PALMATUM 'LITTLE RED'- Will get 4-5' tall and has rich red (purple) foliage. In fall, this dwarf tree will turn glowing red. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'LITTLE SANGO'- Came from A. pal. 'Sango Kaku' which will become 20' in time. This 6' multi stemmed plant will have yellow new leaves changing to medium green for summer. The bark is brilliant red all winter. 1 gal. \$ 90.00



A. PALMATUM 'MANO NO SATO'- Has a creamy white to pink margin to the leaves with a purple greenish center. Fades later in the season. Will have bright orange fall color. 1 gal. \$ 90.00



A. PALMATUM MIKAWA KAEN'- Introduced by Crispin Silva. This cultivar has layered foliage like A. palmatum 'Mikawa Yasubusa' but has more orange, pink new growth. Would be a great container plant. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'MIKAWA YATSUBUSA'- This shrubby sized maple has pretty yellow green new foliage turning dark green in summer. In fall, the foliage will turn orange yellow. The leaves are almost like shingles overlapping each other. 2 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'MYSTIC MIKAWA'- This 3'-4' plant will have orange new foliage that will turn yellow then green as the seasons move on. 1 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'MOONFIRE'- is a moderate growing (12'-14') purple leafed tree. Named by Richard Wolff in the 1970's. Very rich purple foliage and a great red, fall color. 2 gal. \$ 150.00

A. PALMATUM 'ORANGEOLA'- is a lace leaf that is purple foliaged all summer. The new growth has an orangish color through the summer.

Extra shipping 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'PEVE STARFISH'- We are thrilled to be able to offer a few of these maples this year. We first saw several plants at Talon Buchholz's nursery. This lush deep purple foliaged maple has leaves that look like star fish with the margins crimped. Truly beautiful and exciting. 1 gal. \$ 70.00

A. PALMATUM 'RAINBOW'- We have had A. palmatum 'Rainbow' available for years, but can't keep enough. When customers see the plants in Spring-Fall they can't help but buy. The deep purple leaves have patches of rich pink through the tree. Needs afternoon shade.
1 gal. \$ 100.00


A. PALMATUM DISSECTUM 'RED FEATHERS'- Said to be a laceleaf maple with extremely fine textured purple leaves. It is supposed to be dwarf growing and will have great red fall color. 1 gal. \$ 80.00

A. PALMATUM 'RED EMPEROR'- This vibrant purple maple has been around for quite awhile but is still one of the better purple leafed small tree size Japanese maples. 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'RED FILLAGREE LACE'- is one of the finest textured of all lace leafed maples. Originally discovered by Bill Curtis it went through several hands before Iseli Nursery figured out to cut back large trees and graft; creating juvenile stems. A palmatum 'Red Filagree Lace' is slow growing and the beautiful lacy purple leaves are truly beautiful. 1 gal. \$ 85.00

A. PALMATUM 'RED SABER'- Has rich purple foliage with red petioles. this upright maple has beautiful foliage that turns brilliant red in fall. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'RED SENTINEL'- is an upright 10'-12' red foliaged Japanese maple. The purple red foliage turns brilliant red in fall. 1 gal. \$ 100.00


 **A. PALMATUM 'ROYAL RED'**- is a weeping form similar to A. palmatum 'Ryusen'. The foliage will be red purple all summer and will turn bright red in fall. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'RYUSEN'- is a weeping (not cascading) form of A. palmatum. Unless staked, it will grow flat on the ground. This plant needs to be staked and whenever it's released it will weep. Deep green typical A. palmatum leaves that turn pretty red orange in the fall. Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'SHAINA'- is a 6'x 2' bushy shrub maple. The foliage is purple pink through the summer and turns flaming red in fall. Will grow in even the smallest garden. Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 120.00


A. PALMATUM 'SHIRAZZ'- Selected by Duncan & Davies Nursery in New Zealand. The new foliage is vibrant pink with a purple center to the leaves. In summer, the purple centers are consistent. But, the pink margins will change to cream. This should be a 15'-20' tree. 2 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'SHISHIGASHIRA'- (Lions Mane Maple) has small deep green leaves that are twisted and crimped at their margins. The leaves will form clumps on the plant making an artistic effect. In fall, the foliage turns deep yellow-orange. Our 40-year old plant is 15' X 8' without any pruning. 2 gal. \$ 120.00

 **A. PALMATUM 'SIR DAMON'**- Was named by Crispin Silva for this son. The coral bark maple has richer bright red new growth and deeper red winter stems. Nice yellow fall color. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'SIR HAPPY'- Teeny tiny Japanese maple. Our 8-10 year old plant is 6"x3". The tiny foliage is green all summer. Turns orange, yellow in fall. A container plant. 1 gal. \$ 110.00

 **A. PALMATUM 'SKEETER'S BROOM'**- is a seedling of A. palmatum 'Bloodgood' but will only get 4-6' tall. Great red fall color. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

 **A. PALMATUM 'SPRING BLAST'**- Similar to A. palmatum 'Sister Ghost'. The foliage has pinkish and light gray and green as if its in the shadows. 1 gal. \$ 90.00


A. PALMATUM 'STRAWBERRY DELIGHT'- is a variegated maple with pinkish orange new foliage turning green and pink with age. Should have afternoon shade. 1 gal. \$ 100.00

A. PALMATUM 'TAMUKEYAMA'- One of the darkest foliaged of any of the red lace leafs. This cascading lace leaf is a real showstopper summer and fall. This Japanese cultivar was listed in 1710, so tried and tested. 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'TATTOO'- is a 2'-3' shrubby form of Japanese maple. Deep green leaves turning orange yellow in fall. A wonderful container plant. Limited 1 gal. \$ 90.00

A. PALMATUM 'TWOMBLY'S RED SENTINIAL'- Not columnar, but narrow growing. This purple leafed Japanese maple will grow in small areas. Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 90.00
Nursery only 5 gal. \$ 125.00

A. PALMATUM 'UKIGUMO'- 'Floating Clouds' maple. As a young vigorous plant, the leaves will be green. As the plant matures there will be white spots and eventually the leaves will look like they are totally white. A wonderful 10' tree for highlighting the shady garden. 1 gal. \$ 95.00
Extra shipping 2 gal. \$ 110.00

 **A. PALMATUM 'YUKI YAMA'**- This sweet little dwarf has snow-white new foliage held above the dark green older leaves. Yuki Yama means 'snow on the mountain'. 1 gal. \$ 120.00

A. PLATANOIDES 'REZAK'- Only a few of this fabulous tree! Our original (30 years) is 12'x1.5'. The thick deep green leaves make a tight column all summer. The tree grows 6" in a good year. Plants for sale are 3'-4' and probably 6-7 years old. 5 gal. \$ 425.00

A. PSEUDOPLATANUS 'ESK SUNSET'- (formerly A. 'Eskimo Sunset') - This moderate 20' tree has simply stunning foliage. The maple leaves are dark purple underneath and are deep green splashed with white and pink above. In the sun the leaves absolutely glow with the purple and pink. An A. 'Esk Sunset' is always a conversation piece. 1 gal. \$ 75.00

A. SHIRASAWANUM 'AUREUM'- Golden Full Moon maple. We have sold this glorious small tree for 40 years. Our biggest plant is 12' tall and has nice golden leaves all summer turning yellow in fall. Does best with afternoon shade. 2 gal. \$ 95.00

A. SHIRASAWANUM 'MOONRISE'- Looks like A. shir. 'Aureum' but has peachy colored new growth in spring and early summer. Fall color is orange-red.

Extra shipping 3 gal. \$ 90.00

A. SHIRASAWANUM 'SUNNY'- An excellent variety for all summer. It has a bright golden color. Needs afternoon shade, but holds color well. This plant comes from Crispin Silva and is one of the many wonderful plants he has introduced 1 gal. \$ 85.00

ACTEA

A. 'BRUNETTE'- Has deep purple leaves that will get 18" x 18" during summer. In late August, thin stems tower to 4'-5' with fluffy upright flower stalks. The fragrance of the flowers is very nice. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'CHOCOHOLIC'- Has purple chocolate foliage. The foliage will get to 18" tall. The flowers will be on stalks up to 4'. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'HILLSIDE BLACK BEAUTY'- Deep purple foliage in this lovely plant. The dark foliage will get 18" tall and form a pretty foil for the 4' white flowers in summer. 1 gal. \$ 20.00



A. 'PINK SPIKE'- Has dark purple foliage to 18". Out of the foliage appears tall (4") spikes. The difference is most of the other actea varieties have white flowers and A. 'Pink Spike' is soft pink. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'QUEEN OF SHEBA'- is a Piet Oudolf selection from Holland. The very deep purple foliage has flowers that are white and slightly weep when blooming. Wonderful! 1 gal. \$ 20.00

AGAPANTHUS



A. 'BACK IN BLACK'- Grows to 2' in August. The flowers appear in clusters of dark blue purple to black. This is among the darkest of all agapanthus. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'BLACK PANTHA'- Has violet blue flower on 18" stems. The foliage is narrower than A. 'Storm Cloud'. Flowers are much darker than A. Storm Cloud. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'BLUE YONDER'- is a mid blue agapanthus. the flowers are held 18" above the dark green foliage. 1 gal. \$ 20.00



A. 'LITTLE WHITE'- As it says in the name, the plant will get to 12" and has many clusters of white flowers. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

A. 'PETER PAN'- is a small (12") hardy agapanthus that has medium blue flowers in July. 1 gal. \$ 20.00

D. WALLICHIANA- Wallich's Wood Fern-In our garden, plants get 2'x2' and are deep green and vase shaped. One of our favorite ferns. Very beautiful.

H. 'BLACK DIAMOND' - This lovely deep black purple flowers in spring. These single hellebores are superb with cyclamen coum, galianthus, etc. 1 gal. \$ 24.00

This non-clinging vine has deep green leaves. In early summer the plant is covered with white pinwheel flowers that are fabulously scented.

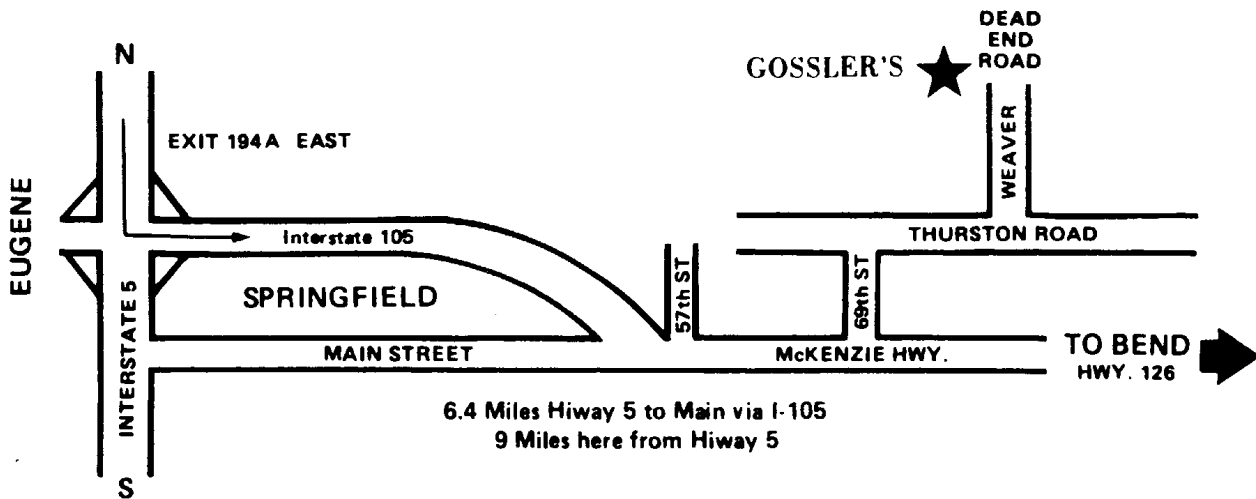

* We would like to discuss our shipping costs. Over the last few years, the cost of shipping has gone up to the point where on certain orders we are losing money on the transaction. Because of this, we are having to place a surcharge on our larger material. We regret having to do this, but we don't have a choice if we hope to continue shipping these larger plants. We are choosing this option so our local customers will not be penalized for the higher shipping rates. Most of the time, you will receive larger plants from us than you would from similar nurseries, and we have always taken great pride in that. However, because of this our boxes are large, and this means we are paying for the size as much as the weight with UPS. What we have decided is to assess a \$20 surcharge on plants requiring the larger boxes we use for shipping. We apologize for this change however we see it as the only way to continue to offer larger material, to you the consumer. Thanks for your continued support and understanding.

TERMS, PLANTS, PRICING AND SHIPPING:

We really care about our plants customers and pricing. So the following is to help explain some of the changes for this coming season.

Plants: Most are cuttings grown from our stock so we know the correct variety. We have grown them at least a year and list varieties in the catalog available at press time and try to indicate if only a few are available. The plants are evaluated as to hardiness, beautiful flowers, foliage, fruit, etc. The plants are taken out of the containers and tied into plastic bags, then secured into the boxes. We do not ship bare root plants.

Price: It is a difficult decision, so we try to be fair so not only the wealthy can afford them (we are collectors too). The availability, propagation, container growing, as well as nursery costs must come into play.

Since shipping costs have risen drastically over the last few years and the boxes for our plants are much larger than other nurseries and therefore much more expensive. We are adjusting our shipping charges after more than 30 years. The following table will be used to calculate our shipping rates. Our minimum has raised but on the larger orders it will work out to less than in the past in many cases.
